Dr. Namugenyi is a General Surgeon at Soroti Regional Referral Hospital (SRRH) and a Lecturer at Soroti University.


She participated in the separation of the now famous conjoined twins at SRRH, a low resource setting with limited capacity to routinely carry out such complex operations.



Girls Unstoppable Uganda a Charity Organization that supports the education and development of marginalized adolescent girls. The organization has awarded 29 scholarships since 2017.


